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## Highlights of Sightseeing

Commence 1 day chartered autumn foliage tour from Nagoya station.

Only 15 minute drive brings you to the Nagoya Castle, a flatland castle constructed by Tokugawa Ieyasu in 1612. Make a brief photo stop here and transfer to Korankei.

Korankei, a valley along Tomoe River, is one of the most popular autumn foliage sites in Central Japan. It is just spectacular to see 4000 maple trees of 11 varieties turn into autumn colors. A symbolic red bridge and the river reflecting autumn leaves add the beauty to the scenery. Take your time to stroll the path for photos.

Move to Sansu Asuke Yashiki, a living museum of old and traditional farm village next to Korankei. Enjoy watching demonstrations of making handicrafts during your free time before leaving to Obara Region.

Obara is famous for Shikizakura which literally means four-season cherry tree, but actually blooms twice in a year: in spring and in autumn. The number of flowers are larger in autumn, and moreover the contrast between cherry blossoms and autumn leaves are just superb and unique.

The coach takes you back to Nagoya station and the tour terminates.
